Signal Communications in the Army comprises:

- Volume I —Principles and Organization of Communications
- Volume II —Regimental Signalling Handbook
- Volume III—The Royal Signals Reference Manual
- Volume IV—Procedures

The aims of the series are:

- (a) To indicate the principles and methods involved in the provision of signal communications for the army.
- (b) To provide, in conjunction with other manuals and handbooks, day to day data required for the provision of these communications.
- (c) To detail signalling procedures and signal staff procedures relevant to the army.

Volume III, The Royal Signals Reference Manual, fulfils the second aim in so far as Royal Signals is concerned. It presents in compact form an outline of the tactical organizations and technical equipments involved, together with signal engineering data and information on signal staff duties to which reference is frequently required. It is in five Parts viz:

Part 1	Royal Signals Units
Part 2	All Arms Organizations
Part 3	Signal Staff Duties
Part 4	Equipment Data
Part 5	Engineering Data

The manual is intended equally for field, office or instructional use where a handy reference to abbreviated and summarized knowledge is required. It does not replace more detailed manuals, establishment tables, equipment handbooks etc, which should be consulted for fuller information. It does not constitute an authority for changes in doctrine or for demanding stores.
